School Directors Award High School Construction Contracts

Moon Area School District school directors awarded 12 contracts totaling nearly \$61.7 million for the construction of the new Moon Area High School on Jan. 12.

"We are very pleased with the favorable bids returned by area contractors as well as the contracts that were awarded. Our high school construction is well within our financial capabilities and school directors' action is evidence of our first step toward a new secondary schools campus. We look forward to moving ahead on our state-of-the-art high school building that will offer unmatched amenities for students, staff and community members," said Dr. Donna K. Milanovich, Superintendent of Schools.

Contracts cover all facets of the high school construction project from general construction to landscaping to food service equipment. Selected companies and construction contract amounts are:

- General - \$38,649,220 to Nello Construction Co. of Canonsburg,
- HVAC - \$7,560,000 to A.J. Demor & Sons, Inc. of Monroeville,
- Plumbing - \$3,082,400 to Vrabel Plumbing Co. of Gibsonia,
- Electrical - \$5,836,400 to Clista Electric, Inc. of Pittsburgh,
- Fire Suppression - \$594,450 to S.A. Communale Fire Protection of Warren, Ohio,
- Technology/Communications - \$2,368,450 to Merit Electrical Group of Pittsburgh,
- Food Service Equipment - \$590,838 to Gateway Kitchens Equipment of Valencia,
- Swimming Pool - \$982,744 to Aqua Pools, Inc. of East Pittsburgh,
- Stage Equipment - \$218,000 to Pittsburgh Stage, Inc. of Sewickley,
- Gym Equipment - \$121,500 to Maffei Strayer Furnishings, Inc. of Pittsburgh,
- Casework - \$1,450,745 to Polyvision of Dixonville and
- Landscaping - \$269,063 to Executive Landscaping of Vienna, Ohio.

School directors also approved \$1,958,307 worth of insurances, commissioning fees and inspection and testing services as required by the Pennsylvania Department of Education.

The roughly 186,000 square-foot building will hold nearly 1,200 Moon Area students and also will house central administration offices. The high school is slated for a groundbreaking in the coming weeks and a 2010 completion date.
