SCHOOL SAFETY GRANT

School safety is always on the mind of parents, students, teachers, and administrators. We were able to take a big step in that area recently when we were informed that we were the recipient of a \$45,426 grant from the State of Pennsylvania. The grant, offered by the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency, was passed by the legislature in 2018. It is offered to all schools with the focus on school safety measures. Mr. Snedeker and Mr. Hamilton worked collaboratively to secure our share of the grant. With this grant, we are able to purchase 27 indoor cameras, 13 outdoor cameras, plus licensing, and cabling for the entire project. This equipment will replace our antiquated camera system and provide video protection to the students and staff campus wide. We are very excited to bring this updated safety feature to our school with no cost to our member school districts.
